I understand many Troops have Troop Trailers. You are welcome to bring these, but I ask you offload your camp supplies and then park trailers in the provided areas as directed by the OA and Crew.**

**This packet will provide participants with the registration forms needed for the event as well as descriptions of the competition events to prepare your Patrols. I encourage Patrols to take advantage of early registration by March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018. Early registration allows Camporee staff to better prepare a safe and enjoyable event for our Scouts. I also encourage Patrols to participate in the preparation service days the weeks before Camporee to help prepare the grounds. Both early registration and helping with site prep gives participants bonus points towards Camporee. These opportunities will be explained more in the packet.**

# **BSA Requirements for Chief Solano Camporee 2018**

**Medical Forms** – Each registered Scout and Scouter must have a completed BSA Annual Medical Form Part A and Part B. Part C requiring a doctor's exam is NOT required for this weekend event. These forms can be found online at <http://www.scouting.org/scoutsource/HealthandSafety/ahmr.aspx>. It is the responsibility of each Troop leader to maintain control of the medical forms for each of their Scouts participating, and to provide Camporee Staff with quick access in case of an emergency. If the Troop leader has to leave the grounds for any reason they need to transfer control of the medical forms to another Troop leader or parent. The Part B of the medical form includes the BSA Talent Release Agreement. If any participant elects not to sign the Talent Release Agreement please bring this to the attention of the Camporee Staff when you check-in. If there are any medical conditions or considerations for any of your Scouts, please bring these to the Camporee Staff's attention at check-in as well.

## **Troop/Webelos Information**

**Check-In** – Friday April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2018 5:00pm-8:30pm – The Scoutmaster and SPL will be the only Troop representatives to come to the check-in area for registration. Campsites will be assigned at check-in and will be based on unit size. Vehicles and trailers can be used to transport Scouts and equipment to their assigned campsite, but then must be parked in the designated parking area as directed by the OA and Crew staff. Again, parking will be limited so arrange to rideshare in the fewest number of vehicles possible to this event.

**Check-Out** – Sunday April 29<sup>th</sup>, 2018 12:00pm-TBD – This year check-out will be happening later than usual. Some of the shooting clubs that also use Yolo Sportsman's Association facilities are graciously putting on a demonstration of their particular shooting sports skills in the Specialty Range Area, and I am asking all Scouts still on site to respectfully attend after Scout's Own but before final check-out and receipt of their Camporee Packet. As always your Troop cannot receive their packets and leave until their campsite has been signed off as clean by Camporee Staff.

# Troop/Webelos Information

**Scout Spirit** – Scout Spirit is the core of everything we do as Scouts and Scouters. It is the embodiment of the Scout Oath and Scout Law, and it is the cheerful and positive attitude displayed in all we do. Scout Spirit is the beacon that sets Scouting apart from other youth programs. It is an expectation that all those participating with the Chief Solano Camporee be ambassadors of the Scouting Spirit in all we do.

**Uniform** – The uniform for Camporee is the BSA Field (Class A) Uniform. The Field Uniform is expected for all Scouts and Scouters during registration, flag ceremonies, Campfire, and Scout's Own. The Activity (Class B) Uniform can be worn during campsite set up, competition, and meals. Please stay aware of the weather for Camporee weekend as well as Yolo Sportsman's Association grounds conditions. It is the responsibility of the Troops to have weather appropriate clothing on hand, as well as a change of uniform if necessary. Uniform inspection will be conducted using the current BSA regulations.

**Emergency Medical Service** – Camporee does provide an event Medical staff for first-aid situations. Scout specific medication and other medical issues should be handled within the Troop. Each Troop should also be outfitted with a campsite first-aid kit that is centrally located.

**Campfires** – There are no authorized campsite campfires. The only campfire location will be the central Camporee Campfire Area. Campsites can use propane stoves and grills for meals or charcoal for grilling or Dutch Oven cooking if a metal tray is used for containment. All these sources of flame should be clearly marked and away from tent areas.

**Cooking/Meals** – It is each Troop's responsibility to provide all meals and snacks for themselves. There will be a tap water source provided for cooking and cleaning. There are no available picnic tables or seating so each Troop must equip this for themselves as well. Each Troop is responsible for the cleanliness of their campsite and for packing away their own trash after the event.

**Food Storage** – There are no food storage lockers on site as nor trees enough for hang bags. The location is rural so expect raccoons, possums, and other forms of wildlife. Each Troop is responsible for supplying their own secure food storage containers.

# Troop/Webelos Information

**Camporee Service** – It is strongly encouraged that Scouters and older Scouts from each Troop help to contribute to the Camporee Program in some way, be it through Honor Guard detail, event sponsorship, or volunteering for staff. There will be OA and Venture Crew members augmenting these as well, but this YOUR Camporee and your help is greatly appreciated.

**Scout Spirit** – I listed this a second time for a reason. Scout Spirit really is the core of what Scouting is and seeing it in action is why I continue to volunteer for Camporee. I love seeing our cheerful Scouts at there best in respectful competition. I love seeing their ingenuity and creativity as they embrace the theme for each year's Camporee. The Campsite Entryways, their Patrol flags, and their Patrol cheers are all so awesome. So awesome in fact that there is an entire award every year for the Patrol who best embodies Scout Spirit. So I encourage all our Scouts to embrace the Scouting Spirit.

**Site Management** – This will be our third year holding Camporee at Yolo Sportsman's Association. We appreciate their dedication to Scouting in letting us use their property for our event. We want to continue to show this appreciation by properly respecting the grounds during our event. This means staying within our area of operation and keeping it, and all its facilities, clean. BSA's Outdoor Ethics should be embraced in full during Camporee. We clean up after ourselves as well as police random litter as we come across it.

Special mention will be made in regards to the restroom facilities this year. We have had success with the port-a-potties that Yolo graciously donates to our event, but last year there was issue with the one hard restroom facility in our area. If your Troop has Scouts using this facility I ask Scouters and older Scout leadership to police the facility after its use to ensure Scouts are respecting the facility and cleaning up after themselves. If at any point I find this facility in a state of disarray, I will immediately shut it down and it will no longer be available for use by Camporee participants.

As in previous years, Yolo Sportsman's Association will be an open to the public and an active range during our Camporee. The Yolo Club House, all ranges, parking lots, and other areas outside our area of operation are off limits to all Camporee participants.

## **Camporee Service Opportunities**

**Service to your community is a cornerstone principal in the foundation of the Scouting movement. Yolo Sportsman's Association has gone above and beyond in showing that they are indeed a part of our community that supports Scouting and wishes to continue providing Chief Solano District with opportunities like Camporee. These two points should be motivation enough for our Scouts to step forward and show their appreciation to Yolo Sportsman's Association through service. In case they need further motivation I will again be awarding bonus competition points to Patrols that have a presence at each of the service days.**

- **Saturday March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2018 – Yolo Trap Shoot Competition – event runs from 8:30am to 4:30pm and involves our Scouts being in Field (Class A) Uniform and picking up spent shotgun shell casings between rounds of shooting. Since it is a long event we can break it down into two sections; the first running from 8:30am-12:30pm and the second running from 12:30pm-4:30pm. I ask that Troops ensure as equal coverage as possible between the two sessions. In addition to being in uniform the Scouts will need to come prepared with sunscreen, water, snacks, and tools like rakes and flat edge shovels to assist in picking up shells.**
- **Saturday April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2018 - Yolo Trap Shoot Competition – event runs from 8:30am to 4:30pm and involves our Scouts being in Field (Class A) Uniform and picking up spent shotgun shell casings between rounds of shooting. Since it is a long event we can break it down into two sections; the first running from 8:30am-12:30pm and the second running from 12:30pm-4:30pm. I ask that Troops ensure as equal coverage as possible between the two sessions. In addition to being in uniform the Scouts will need to come prepared with sunscreen, water, snacks, and tools like rakes and flat edge shovels to assist in picking up shells.**
- **Saturday April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2018 – Camporee Site Prep – event will run from 12:00pm until completion. Uniform will be the Utility (Class B) Uniform, but BSA rules of Class A while traveling will still be observed. I will be leading a Camporee Site clean –up and site prep to ready the grounds for our event. In addition to the uniform please bring gloves, trash bags, and rakes to assist.**

**Participation in each of these service opportunities will earn Patrols/Troops 25 discretionary points per event attended to be used in the case of tie breakers and the coveted Scout Spirit Award. This along with the Scout tradition of service to our community should motivate our participants to have an even greater showing than the impressive numbers we had last year. So let us show Yolo Sportsman's Association our appreciation!**



# Boy Scout Events


\* Each event description will be an accurate overview of the task to be completed in the competition. Target type and count as well as round count may be adjusted in regards to total amount of participants and the supplies on hand. If changes are made from what is described below, the scoring card for said event will reflect the change, and the changes will be described in detail by the event staff before competition begins. I thank you for your understanding.

- **.22LR Rifle Shoot “Counting Cards”** – participants will be provided with a RSO, range masters/instructors, .22LR bolt action rifles, .22LR caliber ammunition, shooting bench, seat, targets, and a 5 round familiarization shoot to acquire their site picture. Participants will then be presented with a target with a series of playing cards, face value between “2” and “10”, and 5 rounds with which to score the highest point total possible. Shooters can only target each card once. Each successful hit to a card will be added together for the individual score. Multiple hits on the same card will only count once when tallying the score. The Patrol total score will be the average score of its combined shooters.
- **20GA Shotgun Trap Range** – participants will be provided with a RSO, range masters/instructors, 20ga pump action shot guns, 20ga shotgun shells, a Trap Range, clay targets, and a 3 round familiarization shoot to acquire site picture and swing. Participants will then be presented with a series of 5 clay targets. Any hit results in a point with a max total of 5 points per individual shooter. Patrol total score will be the average score of its combined shooters.
- **Tomahawk Throw “Cole Slaw Chop”** – participants will be provided with range masters/instructors, throwing tomahawks, targets, and a 3 toss familiarization round. Participants will then be presented with a head of cabbage as a target and 3 tosses of the tomahawk. Each successful sticking hit on the cabbage will score 1 point for a max total of 3 points per individual. Patrol total scores will be the average score of its combined participants.
- **Knife Throw “Cutting Cards”** – participants will be provided with range masters/instructors, throwing knives, targets, and a 3 throw familiarization round. Participants will then be presented with a target board with a number of playing cards as targets and 5 throws with the throwing knives. Each successful sticking hit on a playing card will result in a point with a max total of 5 points. Patrol total score will be the average score of its combined participants.
- **Archery Range “Shooting Salsa”** – participants will be provided with a range master/instructor, recurve bow with arrows, targets, and a 3 arrow familiarization round. Participants will then be presented with a tomato as a target and 5 arrows. Each successful hit into the tomato will result in a point with a max total of 5 points. Patrol total score will be the average score of its combined shooters.
- **Sling Shot Range “Bean Counting”** – participants will be provided with range masters/instructors, sling shot with bullets, targets, and a 3 shot familiarization round. Participants will then be presented with bean can targets and 5 sling shot bullets. Each successful hit that knocks over a bean can results in a point with a max total of 5 points. Patrol total score will be the average score of its combined shooters.

# Boy Scout Events

- **Water Gun Biathlon** – participants will be provided with an instructor/score keeper, Patrol land skis, 3 water guns, and course with can targets on stands. The Patrol Leader will assign water gun shooters and then the Patrol will position their members on the land skis at the course start line. The instructor/score keeper will explain the course, and when given the ready by the Patrol leader will start the timer. The Patrol will then navigate the course using the land skis to approach each firing line, use the water guns to knock over each target can, and once ALL cans are down proceed along the course and repeat. Time stops when the entire Patrol is across the finish line on the land skis. This is a timed event with the fastest time receiving the highest score.
- **Compass Catapult Competition** – participants will be provided with an instructor/score keeper, a compass, a catapult with fruit ammo, an orientation range with target acquisition points, lettered targets, and a target acquisition score sheet. After receiving instruction and their target acquisition score sheets, the Patrol will ready itself and the score keeper will start the timer. The Patrol will then use the compass to acquire the bearings listed on their score sheet, identify the lettered target associated with each bearing, adjust and aim the catapult as needed, and fire one round at each target once acquired. Scoring will be based on time taken to acquire all targets on their score sheet, with a 10 second penalty for each wrong target acquisition. This is a timed event with the fastest time receiving the highest score. **THERE ARE NO POINTS FOR HITS OR PENALTIES FOR MISSES.**
- **First-Aid Knowledge Competition** – participants will be given an instructor/score keeper, first aid supplies, supplies to make an emergency litter, a first aid practice dummy, and 3 first aid task cards. After receiving instruction the Patrol will receive their 3 first aid task cards and time will begin. The Patrol must perform the tasks outlined on the first aid task cards on the practice dummy in accordance with BSA instruction and standard. When the first aid tasks have been correctly completed the Patrol will assemble an emergency litter with the provided supplies, properly and safely roll the practice dummy onto the litter and lift it. They then have to carry the practice dummy on the stretcher along a marked off distance and then successfully lower the litter to the ground. When the litter is on the ground time will stop. A ten second penalty will be assessed for each time the practice dummy slips or falls from the litter. This is a timed event with the fastest time receiving the highest score.
- **Troop Pioneering Catapult Competition** – this event will be the last event of the competition day. Troops will be provided with a sketch diagram of a two person, a-frame pioneering catapult, a firing range, and fruit/vegetable ammunition for their catapult. When the Troop is ready to assemble their catapult they must seek out a score keeper that will observe while the Scouts build the device. Scouts must use BSA approved knots and lashings to assemble their catapult. Improper technique will result in a penalty in scoring. This can take place at any point during the completion day as long as a score keeper has been requested and is present during all of the device construction. At the allotted time, troops will move their catapults to the firing range. Each catapult will fire one at a time and be required fire 2 pieces of the provided ammunition. The second shot will be recorded for distance scoring, with the farthest shot receiving the highest score. If a catapult comes apart and is unable to fire a second round it will receive a 0 score.

## Two Person, A-Frame, Pioneering Catapult Diagram



**The catapult arm indicated with the red arrow must be no longer than 4 feet in length and must be constructed using three separate pioneering poles as pictured. The height of the a-frame at its top apex, indicated by the purple arrow, can be no taller than 3 feet. Type of wood used for the pioneering poles and the rope used in construction is at the discretion of each Troop.**

## **Other Boy Scout Competitions**

**Campsite Contest** – Each Troop will be judged on their campsite layout, organization, and use of camp gateway and other camp gadgets. Up to 50 points will be awarded based off of overall campsite organization and cleanliness. Up to 50 points will be awarded for the Troop's gateway and the appearance and appropriate use of the knots and lashings used. Bonus points will be awarded for use of additional camp gadgets (i.e. lantern tripods, tables, chairs, dish station, etc), and other theme related enhancements.

**Cooking Contest** – Each interested Patrol will need to submit a dish to be judged for a dinner cooking contest. Ingredients and cooking methods will be of the Troop's choosing. At the scheduled dinner time the Patrol will need to request their contest judge who will observe the entire process of the meal. This includes introduction to the judge, a menu with detailed ingredient list, camp kitchen lay out, posted Patrol kitchen duty assignments, safe and proper camp cooking techniques, full Patrol involvement, meal presentation, and finally the taste of the meal. In addition to the presented award for the cooking contest, the winning Patrol will also receive a \$50 cash prize.

## **Gateway Competition Rules**

**Gateway construction is our fun and traditional way of kicking off Camporee. Please let your Scout's mind run free and encourage their creativity. The gateway judges will use the following guidelines when evaluating each Troop's gateway. All construction should utilize knots and lashings as defined in the BSA Handbook.**

- **Unit clearly identified on gateway**
- **Use of theme in gateway**
- **All guidance and construction conducted by youth leadership and Scouts**
- **Flags properly displayed**
- **Gateways are safe and of sturdy construction**
- **Gateways are of appropriate dimensions to comfortably allow entry and egress**
- **All knots and lashings used are correct as defined by the BSA Handbook**
- **Creativity and originality**

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## **Camporee 2018 Competition Scoring**

**Each Scout and Patrol is encouraged to participate in all the events to be able to achieve the maximum number of points. Every Patrol should carry their Patrol Flag with them to every competition, work as a team and involve each member of the Patrol in all events, and demonstrate their Scouting Spirit where ever they go. In all activities and challenges, every Scout should keep SAFETY FIRST as their first goal. All awards are based on the Patrol's achievements based on the standards below.**

- **Each competition will be scored as described in the event description, and will be explained to each Patrol prior to the start of the challenge. There will be awards for each challenge. Each challenge's score will be added towards the overall score.**
- **The uniform inspection will be conducted per BSA guidelines with 1 point being deducted per deficiency with a total of 100 possible points. These points will be added toward the overall score.**
- **Patrol flags will be judged based on creativity and use of theme. Up to 100 total points will be awarded and counted towards overall score.**
- **The Boy Scout dinner and Webelos dessert cooking contest will have up to 75 points that will count towards the overall score.**
- **Campsite and gateway inspection will receive up to 100 points and will count towards overall score.**
- **Bonus points will be awarded for the following: early registration-100, participation in one of the pre Camporee service days for Yolo-25 each, Troop sponsors an event-100, Living the Scout Law-30, and Scout Spirit-30. Bonus points do not have individual awards and only count towards overall score.**

## Webelos Events

- **BB Gun, Archery, and Sling Shot Ranges** – for all Webelos Scout shooting sports events the Webelos Scouts will be working to earn their Webelos Shooting Sports pocket patch along with the Shooting Sports Award Pins. These require specific tasks and knowledge that the Webelos Scout will have to demonstrate to the ranger master/instructor the day of competition. These tasks can be found at [https://www.scouting.org/filestore/program\\_update/pdf/510-320\\_WEB.pdf](https://www.scouting.org/filestore/program_update/pdf/510-320_WEB.pdf) and the Webelos Den leader is encouraged to cover these requirements thoroughly before the day of competition. Camporee Staff will only be providing base instruction in safety and range rules/operation and scoring the BSA requirements for earning each Award Pin, so having your Webelos Scout prepared is appreciated.
- **Water Gun Biathlon** – participants will be provided with an instructor/score keeper, Patrol land skis, 3 water guns, and course with can targets on stands. The Patrol Leader will assign water gun shooters and then the Patrol will position their members on the land skis at the course start line. The instructor/score keeper will explain the course, and when given the ready by the Patrol leader will start the timer. The Patrol will then navigate the course using the land skis to approach each firing line, use the water guns to knock over each target can, and once ALL cans are down proceed along the course and repeat. Time stops when the entire Patrol is across the finish line on the land skis. This is a timed event with the fastest time receiving the highest score.
- **Pipe Roll River Crossing** – participants will be provided with pipes, plank, push poles, and a river course with start and finish line. When instructed by the score keeper the Patrol will board the pipe and plank raft with the Patrol Leader assigning jobs to who will be pole pushers and who will be pipe movers. When ready the score keeper will start the timer and the Patrol will start pushing the raft with the provided poles and picking up pipes as the roll from the rear of the raft and place them in front of the raft. The Scouts repeat until they have crossed the finish line when time will stop. This is a timed event where the fastest time will receive the highest score. A 10 second penalty will be assessed to the score for each time a Scout on the raft touches the ground with their body.
- **Fire Building** – participants will be provided with tinder, kindling, fuel, a ferro rod and fire pit with a length of rope strung above. When instructed by the score keeper the participants will assemble the provided supplies in the fire pit, and when ready the score keeper will start the timer. The participants will then proceed to use the ferro rod to create a spark in the tinder and start their fire. When the fire reaches up and burns through rope the time will stop. This is a timed event with the fastest time receiving the highest score.
- **Knot Tying** – participants will be provided with lengths of rope and a mounted wooden rod. Webelos will need knowledge of how to properly tie the square, bow line, taut line, and double half hitch knots. When instructed by the score keeper, each member of the patrol will take the provided length of rope and tie the knots mentioned above and the timer will start. Time will stop when each member of the Patrol has successfully tied each knot. This is a timed event with the fastest time receiving the highest score.



